


What does Cure Kids do?





The big issues impacting kiwi children



of Kiwi children's overnight hospital stays are due to preventable conditions, with 1 in 4 due to skin infections.



of New Zealand children are overweight or obese, predisposing them to long-term coronary, heart disease, stroke, and diabetes, among others.



of under 5 Kiwi kids suffer from dental decay, which has numerous adverse effects on their short and long-term health. Hospitalisations for young people with serious mental health concerns





over the past two decades.



children and young people are lost to sudden and unexpected death as a result of inherited heart conditions.



Kiwi children live with a lifethreatening illness or genetic malformation. Respiratory conditions are responsible for about a third

of all acute hospitalisations for children.

Between 2017 and 2021, Pasifika children were over 100 times more likely

to be hospitalised with rheumatic fever than children of European or other ethnicities, while Māori children were 40 times more likely.




